Other features on the map include:

- Streets:** Wessex Way, Bath Road, Gervys Place, Hinton Road, Lower Gardens, and others.
- Landmarks:** Royal Bath Hotel, Pter Theatre, Mary Shelley's Grave, Gervys Arcade, Norfolk Royale Hotel, Echo Building, and Civic Centre.
- Green Spaces:** Central Gardens, Lower Gardens, Horseshoe Common, and Cranborne Road.
- Water:** River Bourne and Bournemouth Pier.
- Icons:** Car parks (P), public toilets (WC), bus stops, historical sites (1), and art locations (A).

Take a stroll around Bournemouth's largest art gallery – the town centre! Walls, pillars and railings all become canvases to amazing public art pieces.

Discover a whole range of sculpture, mosaic and mural art, including Dorset's largest mural, as well as a rather humorous depiction of architect, Christopher Crabb Creeke. We've highlighted a few key pieces around the town that are positioned on or close to this trail route. Extend your exploration or pop back another day to focus on our street and public artworks.

Bournemouth Cultural Trail

Access: A moderately hilly circular walking route on hard surface pavement.

Sitting on Bournemouth's beautiful coastline are the buildings that tell the story of its transition from a small seaside resort to the bustling town it is today.

This trail takes you through Bournemouth Town Centre and its listed gardens down to the seafront, walking the routes that were sought out by the Victorians for their health and wellbeing benefits. Stop for a cuppa at The Russell-Cotes Art Gallery & Museum, a historical gem with views out to Bournemouth's iconic pier, then circle back into town, spotting Art Deco features along the way. Visit Mary Shelley's grave and discover who (and what!) is buried within. Explore the unique architecture that features along the High Street and discover the landmarks that tell the story of Bournemouth.
